

From our outbound Youth Exchange Student Maddi Lang

Hello Rotary club of Mooloolaba

In May, my district in Brazil held our Grande Viagem (Big Trip), we went up to the North East of Brazil and travelled along the coastline. It was the most amazing experience I've had in my life. The sights I got to see, and the people I travelled with will stick with me for a long time. We stayed in a range of places including; Manaus, Fortaleza, Jericoacoara, Salvador, Praia do Forte, Presidente Prudente and even the AMAZON!

In Manaus we explored the city and learnt about the natural environment of the rainforest in Brazil. It was interesting to explore the forest there because it reminded me exactly of the Buderim Falls. After Manaus we spent 4 days on a boat on the Amazon River. This is probably the coolest experience of my exchange so far. I loved sleeping in hammocks and waking up surrounded by water just knowing that I was in the AMAZON. Woah. Just woah. While we were in the Amazon, we visited a native tribe and danced with them, we swam with pink dolphins, did a 3 hour walk in the rainforest and even supplied medicine to the local islands which was an incredible experience. Sleeping on a boat for 3 days with 30 other kids really brings you closer with them, especially when the bathrooms didn't work properly.

After the amazon we went to a little beachy, tourist town called Jericoacoara. It is definitely a tourist destination that will 100% try to upsell EVERYTHING there, but would I still recommend going. Absolutely. Jericoacoara was the best place on that whole trip for me. The atmosphere was incredible; it quite literally is in the middle of nowhere. It's surrounded by sand dunes, palm trees and the beach. For me, that's perfect. I enjoyed the three days we stayed there so much. Although I got a little sunburnt it was worth it to swim in the beach and then walk back and sleep in a hammock. I could have stayed there for weeks.

From Jericoacoara we went to Fortaleza and Salvador. Fortaleza was exactly like the Gold Coast. Great big high-rises right on the beach. It was lots of fun to explore the city with everyone. Salvador was roughly the same. It was so much fun to be able to spend all day learning about the history of the city and then come back to our hotels and relax by the pool. We spent one day in Praia do Forte where we saw turtles! Unfortunately, after this our trip was over, we all returned to Presidente Prudente where Rotary held a big meeting for the weekend, and we all said our goodbyes to each other.

About the Meeting

It was disappointing on Monday night to fail to connect with Ms Fleur Maidment BSc MEnvS (UniMelb) and hear and ask questions about the Safe Water for Every Child project in Myanmar, however we aim to connect again on 16 June, 2025.

Fleur is an environmental scientist who has worked in environmental and emergency management for more than 20 years and runs the Safe Water for Every Child - Myanmar. The project aims to empower communities to test water quality and to deliver safe drinking water solutions. 95% of water in Myanmar has been tested as unsafe to drink. Unsafe drinking water causes diarrhoea in young children and is the most common cause of death in children under 5 years.

Fleur and her team have provided safe drinking water to over 70,000 people in remote camps and villages since 2018. She works to provide humanitarian aid to the 3.5 million Myanmar refugees and the 200,000 displaced people as a result of the recent earthquake. The project aims to support 130,000 people in local communities to safe water by 2030. Safe water and sanitation can be provided at \$1.20 per year for each person.
